on this 19th day of November One Thousand Eight Hundred
and Seventy personally appeared before me, the undersigned, a
Justice of the Peace for the county and State above mentioned,

W. J. Cannon who being duly sworn according to
law, declares that he is the identical W. J. Cannon

who was a Private in Captain W. W. Hill's
Company of the First Regiment of

Texas Volunteers Commanded by Edward P. Bunker that he enlisted on the thirteenth

day of March 1836 for the term of Three (3) months

and served until after Battle of San Jacinto
and was discharged at Columbia Brazoria on the

day of November 1836 by reason of
