APPLICATION TO PROCURE A PENSION FOR VETERAN.

(Original.)

The State of Texas, }

County of Bexar

To the Hon. C. L. Wurzbach County Judge of said County and State :

Your applicant Leayetano Castillo being first duly sworn, would respectfully state as follows, to-wit: That he here applies for a pension from the State of Texas.

I. My name is Leayetano Castillo; my age is 70 years; my residence is in Bexar County, Texas.

II. I did not receive a pension under the acts of 1870 and 1874; I did not receive a pension under the act of 1876; I did not receive a pension under the act of 1883; I did not receive a veteran donation land certificate under the act of 1881. (If you did not get the pensions, etc., above referred to, write the word "not" in the blank space left.)

III. The following is a correct list of the real and personal property I own, to-wit: (Here state what property you own.)

One house & lot in the city of San Antonio, Texas, worth about \$300.00

VI. I was for ten years prior to the passage of the pension act passed in 1885, and have been ever since, a bona fide resident citizen of this State.

VII. I was in the actual military service of Texas at the time of the siege of Bexar, in December, 1835. ~~I was at the battle of San Jacinto, in April, 1836.~~ I was in the actual military service of Texas for as much as six weeks between the commencement of the revolution, at Gonzales, in 1835, and the first day of July, 1836. (Erase all the above except that part showing your service.)

VIII. I rendered such service from about the 15th day of October 1835, to about the 15th day of December 1835, and served in the command of Manuel Sal

IX. Stewart & Habicht are my agents to prosecute and collect my pension.
