


Original — Return to Mrs J Taylor, Austin, Texas

Application to Procure a Pension for Widow of Veteran.

The State of Texas,
County of Live Oak

To the Hon. W. A. Hill County Judge of said County and State:

Your applicant Lily E Edwards being first duly sworn, would respectfully state as follows, to-wit: That she here applies for a pension from the State of Texas.

I. My name is Lily E. Edwards; my age is Eighty years; my residence is La Parra, Live Oak County, Texas.

II. I did not receive a pension under the acts of 1870 and 1874; I did not receive a pension under the act of 1876; I did not receive a pension under the act of 1883; I did not receive a veteran donation land certificate under the act of 1881. (If you did not get the pensions, etc., above referred to, write the word "not" in the blank space left.)

III. The following is a correct list of the real and personal property I own, to-wit: (Here state what property you own.)

IV. I have sold or conveyed within twelve months prior to this date, the following property, to-wit: (Here state what property you have sold or conveyed.)

V. I am in indigent circumstances and am dependent upon my labor or the charity of others for a support, and have not transferred to others any property or values of any kind for the purpose of procuring a pension under the act passed in 1889.

VI. I was for one year prior to the passage of the pension act passed in 1889, and have been ever since, a bona fide resident citizen of this State.

VII. The name of my deceased husband was Charley B Edwards. He died on or about the 15 day of October 1899. My said husband was in the actual military service of Texas as follows: (Here state service.)

He was in Sam Houston's army before the battle of San Jacinto in 1836

VIII. My said deceased husband rendered such service from about the day of 1836 to about the 21 day of April 1836, and served in the command of Martins Co. "Houston's Reg." I refer to the records at Austin for his service.

IX. That she is unmarried and has so remained since the death of her said husband.

X. HARRIS & TAYLOR are my agents to prosecute and collect my pension.
