Dear Sir:

I enclose herewith the affidavit of Wm Earl to be filed with the papers pertaining to the application of Jacob Lewis of this County for pension. The affidavit of Earl heretofore forwarded with said application, not being strictly in form, according to the rules established by your office, I have seen proper to have it taken again, believing that in its present shape, it accords with your forms as prescribed.

I send also the application (and accompanying affidavits) of Samuel H. McKueely for pension for both services & wounds. Col. McKueely is a citizen of the State of Louisiana, and was when he volunteered & went to Texas during her Revolution. I was then a lad at the same school from which he went when he volunteered, and remember distinctly the circumstances attending his departure - heard of his wound & captivity, & his subsequent escape - & remember also his return - According to the prescribed forms, my knowledge
