Alonzo Dickinson, a Confederate veteran, registered as a member of this home January 2, 1908, from Valley Mills, Texas, and stated that he was born in the state of Ill. in 1839, and was a farmer by occupation. Came to Texas in 1859. Was a member of Co. D, 16th Texas Cavalry, Waterhouse' Brigade, C.S.A.. Died at the home on July 31, 1912 and was buried in the State Cemetery, Austin, Texas.
