War Department, A. G. O., August 6, 1930. - To The Adjutant General,  
State of Texas, Austin, Texas.

1. The name of one William G. Grumble, residence Travis County, Texas, private, Carrington's Company, Giddings' Battalion Texas Cavalry, Confederate States Army, appears on a roll of Prisoners of War of officers and men of the Confederate States Army. This roll is not dated and the date of parole is not shown.

2. The records show that one W. M. Grumbly, 3rd sergeant, Carrington's Company, Giddings' Battalion Texas Cavalry, Confederate States Army, was surrendered May 25, 1865, at New Orleans, La., by General E. K. Smith. The date of parole is not shown. His residence is shown as Austin. Other records show that William M. Grumbles, Carrington's Company, Texas Cavalry, Fords Command, was paroled at Austin, Texas, July 27, 1865, giving the place of his residence as Travis County, Texas. No other record of him has been found.

3. The records show that Edward D. Grumbles, private, Company C, 17th Texas Infantry, Confederate States Army, was enlisted July 9, 1862, at Camp Terry. Prisoner of War records show that he was paroled July 27, 1865, at Austin, Texas, giving his place of residence as Travis County, Texas.

4. The names Curt Cady and W. H. Catlett have not been found on the records on file in this office of any organization from the state of Texas, Confederate States Army.
