War Department, A. G. O., January 24, 1928. - To the Adjutant General of Texas, Austin, Texas.

The records show that John C. Peevey, private, Company I, 1st (McCulloch's) Texas Cavalry, Confederate States Army, enlisted April 15, 1861, at Gonzales, and on the muster roll for November and December, 1861 (last on file), he is shown absent on detached service since December 22, 1861. The records show that most of the men in the above-named organization subsequently served in Waul's Texas Legion, Confederate States Army.

> The records also show that John C. Peevey, private, Company C, Waul's Texas Legion, Confederate States Army, enlisted May 8, 1862, at Gonzales, and on the muster roll for September and October, 1864 (last on file), he is shown present. His name appears on a roll of Prisoners of War paroled May 13, 1865, at Jackson, Miss.

> The records further show that C. J. Aaron (not borne as Calvin Jackson Aaron), corporal, Company A, 23d Texas Cavalry, Confederate States Army, enlisted April 12, 1862, at Clarksville, and on the muster roll for January and February, 1864 (only roll on file), he is shown present. No later record of him has been found. The records show that the above-named regiment was also known as Gould's Regiment Texas Cavalry.

The records show that a number of men named W. W. Johnson served in various Texas Confederate States Army organizations, but from the information furnished the record of the man in question can not be identified. Captain Boland's Company has not been identified.

> One William Jasper Johnson is shown to have served as a 2d lieutenant in Co. C, 20th Texas Cavalry, Confederate States Army.

> The records show that one William Johnson, Jr., private, Company C, 20th Texas Cavalry, Confederate States Army, enlisted March 10, 1862, at Kaufman County, and on the muster roll for March 22 to May 22, 1862 (last on file), his presence or absence is not stated. His name appears on a Register of Payments on Descriptive Lists, which shows him paid July 11, 1862, \$50.00 bounty money. No later record of him has been found.

The name Rube Tow has not been found on the rolls, on file in this office, of any Texas Confederate States Army organization.
