

A. G. 201 Rogers, Thomas Jefferson (5-4-32)

War Department, A. G. O., May 15, 1932. To the Adjutant General of Texas, Austin.

1. The records show that Thomas Jefferson Rogers was elected 2d Lieutenant of Company D (Captain John K. Coker's Company) 19th Regiment Texas Infantry, Confederate States Army. He was promoted 1st Lieutenant, May 19, 1863, and Captain, April 9, 1864. His name appears on a regimental return for the month of April, 1865, which shows him present., acting Brigade Commissary near Hempstead, Texas. His age is shown as 30 years. No later record found.

2. The records show that S. G. Spellings, not borne as Stephen Spellings, 4th corporal, Capt. T. D. Sedberry's Co., Waterhouse, Jr.'s Regiment Texas Vols., which subsequently became Company F, 19th Regiment Texas Infantry, U. S. A., enlisted May 10, 1862, at Jefferson, and on the company muster roll for Nov. and Dec., 1862, he is reported to have died in hospital at Little Rock, Dec. 20, 1862. His personal description is recorded as follows: Age 20 years; born Red River Co., Tex.; complexion, dark; eyes, gray; hair, brown; and height 5 ft. 10 in. Name not found as of Company D.

3. The name Sol. A. Spellings has not been found on the rolls, on file in this office, of any company of the 19th (Waterhouse's) Regiment Texas Infantry, U. S. A.

4. The records show that one Solomon A. Spellings, private, Company G, 3d Texas Cavalry, Confederate States Army, enlisted May 8, 1862, at Corinth, Miss., and was promoted corporal, June 29, 1863. The company muster roll for May and June, 1864, reports him absent, captured by the enemy, September ~~23~~ 1863.

5. The Union records of prisoners of war show him imprisoned at Rock Island Barracks, Ill., and released there June 22, 1865, on taking the oath of allegiance to the United States. His personal description is recorded as follows: Residence: Jefferson, Tex; complexion, light; hair, brown; eyes, ark blue; height 5 ft. 9-1/2 in., and age 24 years.

6. The name James F. Halsey has not been found on the rolls, on file in this office, of Volunteer soldiers in the War with Spain.
