War Department, A. G. O., April 7, 1931.- To the Adjutant General, State of Texas, Austin, Texas.

1. No record has been found on file in this office of the service in any Texas organization of the Confederate States Army, of a man by the name Augustine Partnership Stockton. The records do show, however, that one A. Stockton, private, Company A, Cooke's Regiment Arkansas Infantry, Confederate States Army, enlisted June 26, 1862, at Trenton, Arkansas, and died August 29, 1862, at Little Rock, cause of death not shown. No medical record has been found.
2. The records also show that one A. Stockton, private, Company I, 12th Regt. Texas Cavalry, Confederate States Army, was mustered into service October 28, 1861, at Camp Hebert, for 12 months, age 26 years. His name is borne on the muster in roll dated October 28, 1861, but is not borne on the only subsequent roll on file, which covers the period from August 31, 1863, to December 31, 1863, and no later record of him has been found nor has any medical record been found.
3. The Confederate records show that Joseph A. Moore was elected Captain of Company G, 9th (Young's) Texas Infantry, (Maxey's) Regiment 8th Texas Regiment, Confederate States Army, to take rank October 7, 1861, and that he was wounded in the Battle of Shiloh, and died April 11, 1862.
4. The records also show that one R. S. Moore (name not borne as Robert Moore), private, Company G, 19th (Young's) Texas Infantry, Confederate States Army was enrolled October 7, 1861, at Tarrant, Texas, at which time his age is recorded as 27 years. The last muster roll of the company on file, which roll is dated April 5, 1864, shows him present with the remark, "Reinlisted." No subsequent record of him has been found.
5. No record has been found on file in this office of the service in any Texas organization of the Confederate States Army of a man named William T. Goodwin, or Albert Melvin Ater, nor has a record been identified of a J. B. Barton, or a Captain J. W. Warden.
