

War Department, A.C.O., May 25, 1932.- To the Adjutant General, State of Texas, Austin, Texas.

1. The name James Wesley Rhodes has not been found on the rolls on file of Company A, 28th Regiment Alabama Infantry, Confederate States Army, which rolls cover in part the period from January 24, 1862 to February, 1864. The records show that many men named James W. Rhodes served in other organizations from that State.
2. The name John Wilson has not been found on the rolls on file of Company B, 4th Regiment Texas Cavalry, Tom Green's Brigade, WhSch., which rolls cover in part the period from August 27, 1861 to January 31, 1863. One J. M. Wilson served as a private in Company I, that regiment.
3. The records show that one A. H. Graham (not borne as Alexander Hamilton Graham), Assistant Surgeon of the 18th Regiment Texas Cavalry, C.S.A., was mustered into service March 15, 1862, at Dallas, Texas, age 31 years. He appears to have served as a Contract Surgeon for that regiment from the 27th day of January, 1862. He tendered his resignation to take effect July 12, 1862. His residence was given as Williamson County, Texas.
4. The records show that one D. S. Terry, Jr., was Captain of an Escort Company of Wharton's Cavalry Corps, C.S.A., in March, 1865, but there are no rolls of that company on file, and no record has been found of the service, capture or parole of William Jefferson Scarbrough as a member of that organization.
5. The records show that one D. C. Rachal (not borne as Darius Cyraque Rachal), Private, Company F, 5th Regiment Texas Infantry, C.S.A., enlisted July 11, 1861, at Beaumont, Texas. He was appointed Corporal February 1, 1863, and paroled at Houston, Texas, June 3, 1865.
6. The collection of Confederate records in this Department is incomplete, and the failure to find the name of a person thereon is by no means conclusive proof that such person did not serve during some period not covered by the records.
