War Department, A. G. O., May 3, 1929- To the Adjutant General, State of Texas, Austin, Texas.

1. Neither the name C. Fosgaard (or Fosgard), G. W. Belfrage, Charles W. Wedemeyer, nor the name Joe Blumrick, has been found on the rolls on file of soldiers in service from the State of Texas, Confederate States Army, during the period of the Civil War.

2. The records show that one R. H. Yarbrough enlisted September 3, 1861, at White Plains, Ala., as a private in Co. C, 5th Battalion Alabama Volunteers, G. S. A., The company muster roll for December 31, 1864 to February 28, 1865, the last roll on file, shows him present. He was paroled at Appomattox Court House, Virginia, April 9, 1865.

3. The records show, however, that one Charles Weidenaur enlisted March 1, 1861, at San Antonio, Texas, as a Private in Capt. Edgar's Co., Texas State Troops. On April 20, 1861, the members of this company were accepted into service as Capt. Edgar's Co. A, Texas Light Artillery, subsequently known as 1st Texas Field Battery (Edgar's Company Texas Light Artillery), C. S. A., The company muster roll for November and December, 1862 (last roll on which borne) shows him present. A subsequent roll of the company covers the period for January and February, 1864. His age is shown as 32 and 33 years.

4. The name C. Weddemeyer (name also borne as C. Weidemeyer) appears and miners, appears on a report of detailed men in the Marine Department of Texas, for the month of September, 1863. The report is dated Marine Dept. of Texas, October 23, 1863, and shows him detailed as a carpenter, June 5, 1863, on boat "Col. Stele." The same is shown in a special order dated May 19, 1864. His age is shown as 24 years. No other record of him has been found.
