1. Your letter of the 4th inst.
is at hand, and replying thereto, beg to advise that the
name of A.W.A. (or William) Vasburgh does not
appear on the muster rolls of the Frontier Battalion of
Texas Rangers.

2. Owing to the Capitol of the State of Texas
being destroyed by fire in the year 1881, a great many of
the records were lost, and no doubt the muster rolls
disclosing the service of the above named applicant were
destroyed therein.
