lawful Agent and Attorney in fact, for me and in my name to ask, demand, receive and receipt for, from the proper officer, or
person appointed, to pay said Company, for the services aforesaid, all monies that are or may be due me, as pay, mileage,
commutation money, and all other allowances whatever that may be made for said services. To include the bonus
allowed by the Legislature of the State of Texas.

And I do further authorize my said attorney to sign my name for me, or as attorney in fact, as may be required to
all receipts or vouchers whatever, that may be required in the premises, and generally to do and perform any and every-
thing in the premises necessary to be done, as fully, amply, and completely, as though I were personally present, and were
doing and performing the same, thereby ratifying the same, and all things lawfully done in the premises.

And I do further transfer to him, my said Attorney, all monies pay, and allowances he may receive as aforesaid, and
by these presents I make this my final and irrevocable power of attorney for the purposes aforesaid. The said Paul Richardson
having paid to me a full and valuable consideration therefor.
