

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME--GREETING:

Know Ye, That I, Edmund J. Davis, Governor of the State of Texas, reposing special trust and full confidence in the Loyalty, Integrity and Ability of Antoine Couillard do, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of said State, constitute and appoint him, the said Antoine Couillard a Private of State Police for all county in said State of Texas giving and hereby granting to him, the said Antoine Couillard, all the rights, privileges and emoluments appertaining to said office.



In Testimony Whereof, I have hereunto set my name and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed, at the City of Austin, the 19th day of July, in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy and the Independence of Texas the Thirty fifth.
