Know Ye, That I, **EDMUND J. DAVIS**, Governor of the State of Texas, reposing special trust and confidence in the patriotism, valor, fidelity and ability of *J. H. Robinson* do appoint him *Private* in State Police of Texas, to rank as *Such* from the *22* day of *September* One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy *Aug*. He is, therefore, carefully and diligently to discharge the duty of *Policeman* by doing and performing all manner of things, thereunto belonging; and I do strictly charge and require all persons under his command to be obedient to his orders, as *Private* of Police; and he is to observe, and follow such orders and directions, from time to time, as he shall receive from his superior officers, set over him according to the rules and discipline, laid down for the guidance of the Police forces of this State.

In Testimony Whereof, I have hereunto signed my name and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed, at the City of Austin, the *29th* day of *August*, in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy *One*, and the Independence of Texas the Thirty
