A member of a Company, whose term of service expires, will use this blank adding the syllable "re," before "enlist."



 Continue to C for full Length 28 1/2
 Sleeve—From D to E (Elbow Point) 25
 Continue to F (Wrist Joint) 31 1/2


Take These Measures Over the Vest.

Breast—Around the Body at H 35 1/2
 Waist — " " " " J 31 1/2
 Seat — " " " " O 38

FOR OVERCOAT.

Measurement same as for Under Coat OVER THE VEST, giving length required.


VEST.



Take These Measures Over the Vest.

Opening—From Collar seam K at back of Neck to first button
 Length—From K to L for full length
 Breast—Around the body at H
 Waist — " " " " J

PANTALOONS.



Stand Erect With the Legs Slightly Parted.

Outside Seam—From top of Waist band M to heel seam of shoe 44 1/2
 Inside Seam — From snug up in crotch P to heel seam of shoe 33 1/2
 Around the Waist under vest 30

 Thigh—Around the leg at S 24
 Knee — " " " " T 19
 Bottom— " " " " W 20
