SIR:

For the purpose of making a complete record of the officers of the Texas Volunteer Guard you are directed to return this circular with your answers in full to the following, to-wit:

1. What is your business address (give street and number)?

Cor. Austin and Bolivar Sts.

2. What is your residence address (give street and number)?

106 S. Edward St.

3. If you have a telephone at your place of business or residence, give number of each telephone?

Residence, No. 57. Office, No. 88.

4. Your native State? Texas. Your age? 25 Years.

5. If you have ever attended a military school, give its name and location.

Bethel College, Russellville, Ky. Not a regular military school,
but has a military Department.

6. Give date of your admission as a cadet, your rank each year and date of graduation?

Was Instructor in the above department with the rank of Captain,
from the date of its organization to that of my graduation,
September, 1894, to June, 1896.

7. If you have served in the Militia of any other State, give name of State, date of enlistment, name and letter of Company, designation of Regiment, or position in Staff Corps, rank during said service and date of discharge or resignation.

I was supposed to be commissioned by the State of Kentucky, but

I do not remember to have ever received a commission.

8. If you have served in the Confederate or Union Army or in the U. S. Volunteer or Regular Army, give date of enlistment, name and letter of Company, designation of regiment, or position in the Staff Corps, rank during said service and date of discharge or resignation.

Served as Hospital Steward in the 3rd Texas, U.S. Vol. Inf'ty, from

June, 8th 1898, to Dec. 6th 1898. Was discharged by "favor".

9. If you have served in the Texas Volunteer Guard prior to date of your present commission, give date of enlistment, name and letter of Company, designation of regiment, or position in Staff Corps, rank during such service and date of discharge or resignation.

Was a charter member of the Fry Guards, late Co. "G", 5th Reg. T.V.G.,

organized about Sept. 1st, 1891. Was made 2nd Corporal in Oct. same

year; 3rd Sergeant in Spring of '92, and elected 2nd Lieut. in July, '93. Served as Lieut. in the encampment of that year, but never received my commission. Served as Sergeant-major, 1st Bat. 5th Regt., at Camp Mabry in '94, and at San Antonio, in '97, but never received a warrant for above rank.

10. Give details of your actual service in riots, skirmishes or battles.

Your service in the Texas Volunteer Guard or in the U. S. Volunteer Army in the war with Spain will be verified by the records of this office.

You will endeavor to give an accurate account of your military services as outlined above. If more space is needed, attach statements. You will sign the following certificate to-wit:

In stating details of service in answer to Numbers 6, 7, 8 and 9 you will give beginning date of each rank in each organization in which you have served. For example, (presuming a case) in answer to number 9: "Private Co. A., (Smithville Rifles), 1st Regt. Infy., T. V. G., January 7th, 1892; Corporal, November 20th, 1892; Sergeant, July 1st, 1893; 2nd Lieut., January 4th, 1894; Resigned June 3rd, 1895. 1st Lieut. Co. G, (Jonesboro Rifles), 1st Regt. Infy. T.V.G., January 6th, 1896; Captain, January 8th, 1897; Major 1st Regt. Infy., T.V. G., June 20th, 1898 honorably discharged by G. O. No. 14, A. G. O., Nov. 22nd, 1899."

The above would indicate continuous service except between June 3rd, 1895, to January 6th, 1896, and that each rank continued until date of next rank except time following resignation.

In the event there is no record of your service the words "the records of" in above certificate may be erased.

The proper business and residence addresses and telephone number of each officer is important, that he may be reached without delay with orders in cases of emergency.
