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

If you can assign or attach me to any Special duty- that will not require such prompt demands on my time, I would be glad to remain on the active list of the Guard, but if you cant do this, I ask, Sir, that you place me on the retired list of the T. V. G. with my present rank.

I believe that my almost fourteen years service will entitle me to this: I having joined the Fort Worth Fencibles June 10th. 1886 as 3rd. Sergt. and held various noncommissioned offices in the Company until June 23rd. 1893 when I was appointed Adjt. of the 3rd. Regt., which position I held until Nov. 22nd, 1899 when I was mustered out and then appointed to my present position . I am, Sir,



One W. B. Ford and myself were the prime movers in organizing the 1st

Worth Terribles June 10th 1886. The Company was under various letters from H. to A in the 4th Regt Infy I. V. G. I held various non-commissioned offices (was at one time elected Lt. but did not qualify as I could not attend the Encampment that year) from its organization until June 23rd 1893 at which time I was commissioned by Gov. J. S. Hogg 1st Lt and assigned as Adj of the 4th Regt under command of Col J. A. Steyer - which place I held until honorably discharged by G. O. No. 14 A. G. O. Nov 22-1899

(All the records and property of the Ft Worth Terribles were destroyed by fire in 1894- or 1895- and I can't remember dates etc and letters of Co.)

In stating details of service in answer to Numbers 6, 7, 8 and 9 you will give beginning date of each rank in each organization in which you have served. For example, (presuming a case) in answer to number 9: "Private Co. A., (Smithville Rifles), 1st Regt. Infy., T. V. G., January 7th, 1892; Corporal, November 20th, 1892; Sergeant, July 1st, 1893; 2nd Lieut., January 4th, 1894; Resigned June 3rd, 1895. 1st Lieut. Co. G, (Jonesboro Rifles), 1st Regt. Infy. T.V. G., January 6th, 1896; Captain, January 8th, 1897; Major 1st Regt. Infy., T.V. G., June 20th, 1898 honorably discharged by G. O. No. 14, A. G. O., Nov. 22nd, 1899."

The above would indicate continuous service except between June 3rd, 1895, to January 6th, 1896, and that each rank continued until date of next rank except time following resignation.

In the event there is no record of your service the words "the records or" in above certificate may be erased.

The proper business and residence addresses and telephone number of each officer is important, that he may be reached without delay with orders in cases of emergency.
